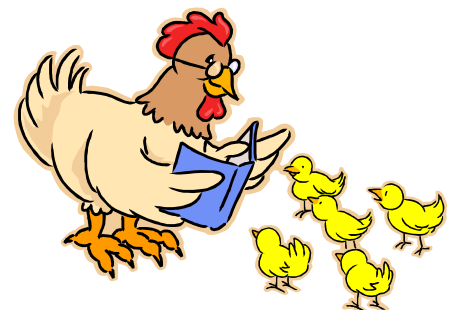

November 29 — Rev. Msgr. Michael Cariglio, of Our Lady of Mount Carmel

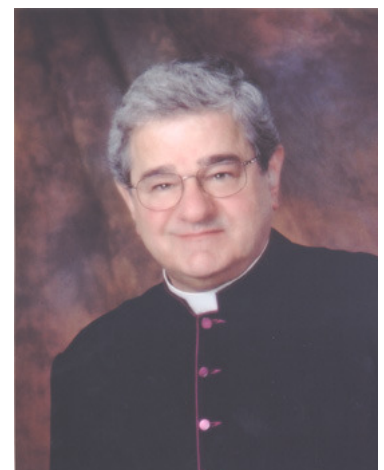

A PERFECT THANKSGIVING**BY DEACON RON BUNOFSKI, ASSISTANT SPIRITUAL DIRECTOR**

With Thanksgiving just around the corner let us consider this question:
For what or to whom are we thankful today?

Maybe a broken relationship is on its way to being rebuilt. Perhaps some problem that has been weighing heavy on your heart has been lifted from you. Maybe you give thanks for years of love and dedication of your spouse. Parents often feel pride in the accomplishments of their children. We all have our own stories of thankfulness.



And there are many blessings, less dramatic, we receive everyday. A cold drink of water when we are really thirsty, a smile, a laugh of a child, fall colors and many more.

For things people great and small we should be thankful. Yet there is another aspect of thankfulness, often overlooked that is important. If we want our thankfulness to be complete we must also give thanks for our crosses and burdens in life. Why give thanks for our crosses? Because some of our greatest opportunities to grow only comes through the pain and suffering of our crosses.

In St. Luke's Gospel (17:11-19) we read about the ten lepers who cry out to Jesus:
"Jesus, Master have pity on us!" All ten are healed yet only one, a Samaritan, returns to give thanks.

Or consider St. Paul who was brought down low as he was literally knocked off his "high horse" and blinded before he came to see the glory of God. (Acts 9:1-9)

With St. Paul and the Samaritan leper a physical healing took place, however, a deeper healing also happened. Through their adversities, they both received a living faith, a true spiritual healing, through the saving grace of our God. We call this salvation. Their crosses became an opportunity for true healing both physically and spiritually. The Samaritan leper and Paul are what they are because God's healing grace worked through their burdens and pain.

So it is with us, every cross we carry, every burden we have, has the potential of producing good in our lives because of the power of Jesus Spirit within us. It is up to us to use this saving power of Christ.

Rather than asking why me Lord believe and know that with the Lord and His saving grace within you, you can overcome any problem and good will come from it. And although you may not see today how things will work out, know that, with God good things will happen regardless of how hopeless circumstances may seem at first.

So, for what or whom are you thankful for this day? Do you give thanks for all good things great and small and do you give thanks for your crosses and burdens? This makes for a perfect Thanksgiving. Be thankful in this way because when you do you will hear the words of Jesus in your life:
"Stand up, go your way, your faith has saved you!" (Luke 17:19)

A Sacristan is one who helps prepare for Liturgy and can help others to properly serve Mass. Monsignor Cariglio and his parishioners have been very welcoming to Cursillo, allowing us to use their parish Church and facilities for our Ultreya. The Ultreya team needs to be trained on the particulars of proper use of Our Lady of Mount Carmel Church facilities. PRE CURSILLO — LINDA SMREK

Dear Cursillistas,

I would like to give you with some guidelines on sponsorship that are taken directly out of the ***Cursillo Leader's Manual***: As you already know, in order to make a Cursillo Weekend, a Cursillista must sponsor you. Before you offer to sponsor an individual, you should really know your candidate. Will your candidate be good for the Cursillo, and will Cursillo be good for your candidate?

Those who attend a Weekend:

- Must be a graduate of High School to the age of 70, however exceptions can be made.
- Must be eligible to receive the Sacraments.
- Should be trying to live the Catholic life as best they know how.

Ideally, candidates should be leaders in their environments. By leader, I'm not referring to a "boss" or supervisor, but to anyone who is respected and whose opinion matters. Someone who by their presence makes a difference in their environment. Someone who brings Christ to family, friends, or co-workers by their actions.

Those who cannot attend a Cursillo weekend are...

- Those who have psychological or emotional problems
- Those who have deep drinking, drug or moral issues
- Someone looking for a quick fix to severe life problems
- Non-Catholics or those who cannot receive the Sacraments.

The most important thing when you consider sponsoring someone is to talk to God about your friend before you talk to your friend about God. It is *suggested* that you sponsor no more than one candidate for the same Weekend, and you are asked to be an active member of Cursillo for at least one year before sponsoring a candidate.

We have Sponsorship Guidelines that explain how to be a good sponsor to your candidate before, during and after the Weekend. I encourage you to review these guidelines. When you sponsor someone, have their spouse fill out an application to attend a Cursillo as well. Even if the spouse decides not to make the next Weekend, it will be on file for them for three years. Above all else, you should be a member of a Group Reunion, and your candidate should be able to see Jesus Christ in you and be attracted by His presence.
