It is with sadness that I must report the passing of our Cursillo Spiritual Director, Father Bill Loveless. He made Men's Cursillo weekend #22 at JFK High School from November 28—December 1, 1974 when he was a Deacon, and from that point forward became very active in the Movement. He truly loved Cursillo. Over the years, he belonged to several small groups, and was always a source for Spiritual Direction and guidance. Whenever he was asked to serve as the Spiritual Director on a Cursillo weekend he always said yes. We will miss him very much.

The funeral services will be held privately. However, a Farewell Ceremony will be held **Tuesday May 5**, **2020 at 11:45 AM** at St. Brendan Church 2800 Oakwood Ave., Youngstown, OH 44509. Family, friends, parishioners and Cursillistas are invited to gather at approximately 11:45 a.m. on Tuesday in their vehicles, and form a procession line in the St. Brendan Church parking lot (by using the Schenley Avenue entrance) for a drive-by tribute to Father Bill as he leaves the church. 

Father Bill Loveless Obituary



YOUNGSTOWN - Rev. William J. Loveless, 71, pastor of St. Brendan Church in Youngstown, passed away at St. Elizabeth Youngstown Hospital Tuesday afternoon, April 28, 2020, after a courageous battle with esophageal cancer.

"Father Bill" as he was affectionately known to all was born Oct. 17, 1948 in Youngstown, and was the first-born son of the late Holland Loveless and Helen Kostelnak Loveless.

He attended Sheridan and Jackson schools, and Woodrow Wilson High School in Youngstown, where he graduated in 1966 as the class valedictorian. He then attended Youngstown State Univer-St. Gregory Seminary in Cincinnati for his priestly studies.

After earning a bachelor's degree in philosophy from St. Gregory's, he attended Mt. St. Mary's of the West Seminary, where he earned masters degrees in philosophy and theology.

He was ordained June 7, 1975, by Bishop James W. Malone at St. Columba Cathedral in Youngstown, and Father Loveless's first assignment was as associate pastor at Boardman St Charles Parish.

In 1977, Father Bill was transferred to St. Patrick Parish in Hubbard and also began a three-year term on the diocesan Liturgical Commission. Early in his priesthood he became involved in the Cursillo movement, serving for years as spiritual director for the Youngstown-area Cursillo and as spiritual advisor for Region Three, which includes Eastern Ohio, West Virginia, and parts of Pennsylvania and New York.,

In 1982 he became associate pastor of St. Rose Parish in Girard, and in 1985 was named chaplain at St. Elizabeth Youngstown Medical Center. The following year, he was named pro-tem associate pastor, and then associate pastor at St. Pius X Parish in Warren. In 1988, he served as pro-tem associate pastor at St. Mary Parish in Newton Falls. Following a leave for graduate study, Father Loveless was named pastor of Holy Rosary Parish in Lowellville. In 1993, he became pastor of St. Pius X Parish in Warren.

Father Loveless became pastor of St. Brendan Parish in 2011, where he served until his untimely passing. Additionally, he served as a member of the diocesan Priest Retirement Board and as administrative secretary for the diocesan Priests Council.

Father Bill is survived by his sister Susan E. (John) Desko of Austintown; his brother, Michael T. (Colleen) Loveless of Kent, Wash.; a nephew. David Desko; four nieces, Katelyn Desko, Sarah (Joseph) Harrison, Megan Loveless, and Jennifer Loveless; two great-nephews, Nathanial Desko and Bently Harrison; and two great-nieces, Kallie Harrison and Emma Loveless-Sawka.

Because of the current virus pandemic, a private Mass of Christian Burial will take place at St. Brendan Church in Youngstown on Tuesday, May 5. Family, friends, and parishioners are invited to gather at approximately 11:45 a.m. on Tuesday in their vehicles, and form a procession line in the St. Brendan Church parking lot (by using the Schenley Avenue entrance) for a drive-by tribute to Father Bill as he leaves the church. All are kindly asked to remain in their vehicles at all times during this farewell to Father Bill.

Private entombment will follow the farewell tribute, and will be at Calvary Cemetery in Youngstown. Arrangements have been entrusted to Kinnick Funeral Home in Youngstown.

A public Memorial Service will be held at St. Brendan Church at later date. We will let you know in the Cursillo Newsletter for date and time as details become available.

Memorial Day Relection — Father Bill Loveless

Thank you to Mike Hripko, who found the reflection below in one of the old bulletins from St. Brendan's Church. Father Bill wrote this in 2014, and yet it seems very appropriate to share it this month.

Remember With Love

In my family there was always a special ritual connected with Memorial Day. Every year within a few days of the holiday, my mother and my Aunt Jane, and after my mom had died, Aunt Jane and I made a point to visit all the graves of our family members. We would go to a garden shop and buy 15 to 20 geraniums. They had to be white, pink, and red, unless we could find some that were coral-colored. Then we would visit each of the graves of our family members in Calvary, Resurrection, Forest Lawn, and St. John's Cemeteries. And, on my own, I would add Hubbard Union to our list of cemeteries to visit, because that is where my father's family members are buried.

At first, when Aunt Jane was still healthy, she would take small grass clippers, a bucket of water, a cloth, and a whisk broom to clean each grave stone. In those days, I was still learning from her how to find all the graves. In more recent years, she could only sit in the car and pray as I would visit each grave, spruce up the marker, and offer prayers before leaving a geranium.

In American society at large, Memorial Day and Labor Day have become bookend holidays enclosing the summer season, and so they are often devoted to outdoor summer activities, like picnicking, boating, and the like. Of course, I enjoy those activities as much as anyone else. But I hope that Memorial Day (Labor Day too!) will keep its unique focus for us. If you haven't been to a family member's grave recently, why don't you go? Think of the events of their life that you enjoy recalling. Think of your own life and its limits. Enjoy the green of the cemetery. Enjoy the quiet. Then say a prayer.

I heard a voice from heaven say, "Write this:

Blessed are the dead who die in the Lord from now on."

"let them find rest from their labors,

for their works accompany them."

May the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.
